

Psalms, Proverbs and the Books of Wisdom



Everyone, please read these Scriptures in your Bible: Read four key Psalms: Psalms 22 (a picture of Calvary) Psalms 23 (Jesus as Shepherd), Psalm 46 (God as refuge one of Luther's favorites) and Psalm 51 (written when David was caught taking Bathsheba and then killing her husband. Psalm 51 is his cry for mercy from God.) We encourage you to download and listen to <u>The Bible App YouVersion</u> while

reading along.

You will find many quotations from Psalms in the New Testament. At least 20 of these are in direct reference to Christ and his life and death.
