Q & A

WHAT IS THE COST? \$500 per middle schooler. This covers transportation, all meals from Sunday night to Thursday morning and offsets the cost for adult leaders. Additional money (TBD) will be needed for fun day expenses and meals eaten on the road.

There is an additional \$50 fee for registrations received after December 1.

WHAT IS THE PAYMENT SCHEDULE? A \$150 non-refundable deposit secures your spot. A second payment of \$175 is due February 1, 2025 and you are then *committed to paying in full*. If your plans change, your spot is transferable to another middle schooler until February 1, *but it is not refundable*. The final \$175 is due April 1.

ARE THERE FUNDRAISERS? Thanks to generous donors in our congregation, we are not planning to sponsor any group fundraisers for this trip. You can (and should!) mow yards, rake leaves, babysit, hold your own garage sale, etc. to raise funds. Consider asking relatives, godparents, or other family friends for direct financial support, especially at Christmas or your birthday.

ARE SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE? Yes, Christ Lincoln will offer scholarships for students who apply. Please pay the deposit at registration and watch for a application link in January.

WHO CAN COME? All current 6th-8th grade students. We have secured 20 student reservations, but we can ask to add more registrations if spots are available with NextStep.

WHAT ARE THE ACCOMMODATIONS? Southpark Baptist Church in southwest Oklahoma City will host us for the week. NextStep provides meals and college-age mission interns who will also lead us in worship and serving. Please leave all electronic devices (phones) at home so we can focus on building relationships.

WHY OKLAHOMA CITY? After two devastating tornados in 2013, Next Step began serving in OKC to help rebuild. Now, 12 years later, NextStep is focused on rebuilding community, supporting families, and caring for the vulnerable.
